Record house sales



Houses at Kings Hill

House builders at Kings Hill sold more houses in the first six months of this year than they did in the previous two years and now, according to the latest figures from

the Land Registry, one in every seven houses sold in Tonbridge and Malling borough are at Kings Hill.

City access

Train services to the City from West Malling (Kings Hill) are to be reinstated under the new Thameslink franchise. In the tender documents, the Department for Transport states that the winning bidder will have to provide a minimum of two trains to the City per hour during the three-hour morning and evening peak times as well as a regular service throughout the rest of the day.

This new Thameslink service will provide direct access to three City stations which are either a short walk or tube journey from every possible destination in the City. The new service will start in 2018.

New coach service to London

Brookline Coaches has started a commuter service from Kings Hill to London. The luxury coach, with on-board wi-fi, picks up from seven locations at Kings Hill. London stops include Cannon Street, Canary Wharf and Westminster.

The new Kings Hill Sports Park

The Kings Hill Football Club is 'over the moon' with the new £4million sports park that was handed over to the Parish Council for the people of Kings Hill in August.

Club chairman Dan Mason said: "We cannot express enough what a high standard these facilities have been built to and we are very thankful to Liberty and the Parish Council for working closely with us on the project from the outset.

"The facilities will allow us to grow as a club, attract and retain players, become more competitive and to achieve our goal by entering teams in the Kent Youth League for years to come.

"The fact that we will have all of our teams training and playing in one facility on a weekly basis will help create a fantastic club atmosphere and bring the whole community closer together."

Kings Hill Sports Park has five grass pitches, an artificial pitch, pavilion with changing rooms for six teams together with a kitchen, social space, officials' rooms and allotments.

Handing over the new sports facility to Kings Hill Parish Council on behalf of Liberty and Kent County Council, Mark Dance, KCC Cabinet Member for Economic Development said: "The sports park will be owned and run on behalf of residents by the parish council, so in every sense this will be a community facility that will further add to the quality of life at Kings Hill. It's a prime example of

the Big Society in action."

Advance bookings for the 3G pitch are very healthy. Kings Hill Football Club, other local football and rugby clubs and soccer schools are now using the pitch for their mid-week training and matches. The grass pitches will be used exclusively by Kings Hill Football Club at the weekends for its matches and local soccer schools will hold their holiday clubs on the 3G pitch during the holidays throughout the year.
