'Running Airman'

A special Service of Commemoration is being held at Kings Hill on May 16 to mark the 70th anniversary of the Dambusters, one of the best known and most daring bombing raids of World War II.

Organised by Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council and supported by Liberty and Kent County Council, the commemoration will be led by Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant of Kent. Viscount De L'Isle MBE.

Everyone is welcome and the day will include a Service of Commemoration next to the RAF West Malling Memorial 'Running Airman' sculpture at 12.30pm and a Spitfire flypast at around 2pm. The best viewing spot for this will be from the new

piazza between the Control Tower and Waitrose.

The Dambusters raid used 'bouncing bombs' to destroy the dams of Germany's Ruhr Valley and Kings Hill's connection with the mission is through the squadron's commander Guy Gibson, who served with 29 Squadron based at RAF West Malling in 1941/2. He loved his time there and said: "Of all the airfields in Great Britain, here, many say, including myself, we have the most pleasant."

Wing Commander Gibson was awarded the Victoria Cross for his bravery during the raid and a wreath and other tributes in his memory will be laid alongside the 'Running Airman' sculpture, which commemorates the

aviation past of Kings Hill. It honours the military and civilian personnel who were based there throughout the years. It was unveiled in 2002 by the late Richard Todd, who played Guy Gibson in the 1955 film 'The Dam Busters'.

"The Dambusters squadron was based at RAF Scampton in Lincolnshire but because of Guy Gibson's close connections with RAF West Malling we wanted to mark the occasion here as well," said Andrew Blevins.

Mayor Elect of Tonbridge and Malling Councillor Howard Rogers said: "We are very lucky to have such a rich heritage at Kings Hill and it is a wonderful opportunity for us to involve the whole community."

NewBuy helping people move to Kings Hill

The Government's NewBuy scheme, which enables people to buy a new home with just a five per cent deposit, is having a positive impact on house sales at Kings Hill

Five of the homebuilders at Kings Hill offer the scheme – Bellway, Crest Nicholson, Hillreed, Taylor Wimpey and Ward Homes – and, said Annette Cole of Crest Nicholson: "We have seen a high number of 'second-steppers', especially young families looking for additional space, showing an interest in NewBuy.

"It enables them to take the next step up the property ladder without breaking the bank"

Anyone can apply for the NewBuy scheme – which was a year old last month – providing the home is being bought as a main residence, that it costs up to £500,000 and has been built by a builder taking part in the scheme.

New homes are available at Kings Hill priced from £239.995 to £499.995.

Russet's new offices

Liberty has just signed Kent's largest commercial property transaction so far this year.

Russet, Tonbridge and Malling's largest social housing provider, has taken an extra floor in its new headquarters 32 Tower View to add to the space it leased at the end of last year, which was also the largest transaction in the county for the year.

Russet's move to Kings Hill later this year will allow the housing provider to overhaul its customer services, streamline its operations and pass on a series of costsaving benefits to its 16,000

customers. The new headquarters will replace Russet's Borough Green, Larkfield and Tonbridge offices with one central premises where Russet's staff can meet with customers.

Russet's group partner Invicta Telecare, which provides telecare services to more than 2,000 people in Tonbridge and Malling, will share the building and more than 170 people will work at the new headquarters.

Full disabled facilities and dedicated computer access will be included on site for residents' use thanks to a £1million refurbishment of the

new space by Liberty.

Caroline Binns, Liberty's head of leasing, said that Russet's and Invicta's move is a great endorsement for the park. "Their original commitment to the ground floor of the building was the largest commercial property transaction in Kent last year and we are delighted to be able to organise the extra space for them this year," she said.

"Our investment in the quality refurbishment of the building has proved a success and a great benefit to our new tenants."

Ace colour for Kings Hill

With the refurbishment of Kings Hill's art deco Control Tower nearly complete, six mature acer trees have been planted nearby to provide colour and seasonal interest.

They were specially selected from Hillier Nurseries - who were responsible for providing many of the trees for the Olympic park – and at seven metres high the trees needed to be planted with the help of a crane, which winched them into place.

The variety is Acer platanoides 'Deborah' - a type of Norway maple which changes colour three times during the growing season, going from bright red in spring, to dark green in summer and orange/yellow in autumn. Clusters of redflushed, yellow flowers bloom on bare branches in early spring. The trees can reach over 15 metres when fully grown.

"The contrast in the leaf colour is stunning and the trees will look wonderful against the bright white of the Control Tower's exterior," said Liberty's Susan Davies.

When development began at Kings Hill nearly 25 years ago, one of the first tasks was mass planting of mature broad-leaved trees and conifers. This helped turn the flat, treeless site - a legacy of its past as an airfield - into an interesting landscape.

"We have planted over seven thousand trees which, together with areas of ancient woodland that we have conserved, make Kings Hill a green, leafy place to live and work," said Susan.

"Landscaping and the reforestation of Kings Hill is an important part of placemaking. We have invested substantial funds and time in sourcing the best trees to go some way towards returning the land to what it would have been before it was levelled and the runway created."
