Double gold for Kings Hill

For the second year running Kings Hill received two gold medals in the annual South & South East in Bloom competition.

It was awarded a gold and came first in the Business Landscape category, and another gold in the Town Centre category, where it was also named the best in the county.

The judges said the public areas are 'maintained to an excellent standard' and that 'from the moment you arrive

in Kings Hill you are struck by the well maintained roads, verges and public spaces with impressive pieces of artwork located at key locations set off by careful planting'. Kings Hill, they said, 'continues to maintain extremely high standards of horticulture and landscaping'.

The involvement of the community also impressed the judges especially the way children are encouraged to get 'hands-on' by planting flowers and helping local wildlife by making bird boxes.

Emma Cottee, Liberty's estate and property management supervisor, is responsible for the landscaping with the help of Coblands, ecologist Susan

Deakin and the support of the three schools, numerous clubs and societies and residents.

She said: "It's fabulous to have been awarded two gold medals for a second year in a row and it's a credit to the many people who work so hard to make Kings Hill a lovely place to live and work. We scored highly across all the judging criteria including community involvement, horticultural considerations, environment, maintenance and landscaping."

Kings Hill School also entered the awards, gaining a Gold and best school in the South East for the RHS project in the Schools Environmental Challenge.

New play area for park

Planning consent has now been given for the play area and the fencing, and the play equipment has been ordered with installation due to be completed soon. The new play equipment will include slides, swings, spinners, a seesaw, jungle climber and a timber log walk.

The footpaths in the new park are being surfaced and once this, and the playground, have been completed the landscapers will be putting the finishing touches to the planting.

The mature trees are now in and already showing off their autumn colours, the shrubs are planted and the grass areas seeded and looking healthy, despite the lack of rain earlier in the year. Lighting has been installed and the park's focal point, the amphitheatre, complete and
